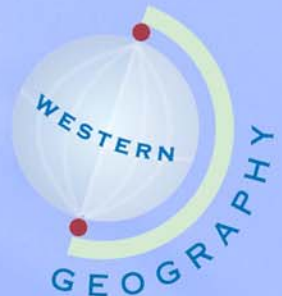


# JOY PARR LECTURES
